

Areas of Learning and Experience

Instead of traditional subject areas as you may know them, learning will be separated into six 'Areas of Learning and experience.'

This is to signal the importance of learning as a broad and connected range of experiences that broaden children and young people's horizons, stimulates imaginations and promotes enjoyment in learning.





Religion, Values and Ethics

Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE) is a core subject and at the heart of St Winefride's Catholic primary



There are 6 topics covered:

Creation and covenant
Prophecy and Promise
Galilee and Jerusalem
Desert to Garden
To the Ends of the Earth
Dialogue and Encounter

They will learn about the teachings of the church and the Bible through playing, exploring, active learning, creating, and thinking critically.

All learning will aim to help them experience the awe and wonder of God.

- I am happy, I love to smile.




What makes me happy

Nursery Session Times:

Reception Session times:

9.00am-3.15pm

Classroom doors open at 8.50am

What do they wear?

Here at St Winefride's Catholic Primary School, all children are requested to wear the school's uniform.

Uniforms can be tried on and purchased from First Class Clothing. They are competitively priced and are of very good quality.

Nearly new uniform is also available and the school regularly holds a uniform sale as part of our Ecoclub work.



What do they wear?

The Nursery and Reception children will be taking part in a PE session at least once a week.

For this, they require full P.E kit, which consists of:

White t-shirt

Black shorts/leggings

Black pumps or trainers for outdoor P.E



Snack Time





Children in Foundation Phase have a healthy snack and a drink before play time every day.

This consists of a piece of fruit or vegetable and a glass of milk or water.

Children will be able to access a rolling snack throughout their session where they will be encouraged to prepare it with the support of an adult.

Snack Time



We provide snack to children who want to join the scheme at a cost of £42 (in advance) for the full academic year. This is towards the cost of providing one healthy snack each day.

We have an online app called 'School Gateway' and all money is paid via this app.

Alternatively, you can provide your own fruit / vegetable snack on a daily basis.

What does the Foundation Phase promote,

The development of the whole child.

Looking to provide them with the skills to progress in their personal, social, emotional, physical and intellectual well-being.





It develops positive attitudes towards learning.

It also aims to raise the self esteem and self confidence of each child.



Play is important!

Here at St Winefride's we believe the most effective way for a child to learn is through play or active learning.

Our job is to provide carefully planned learning experiences, which challenge and extend each individual child within their play.



In developing the whole child, the Foundation Phase places huge importance on learning through play indoors but, also equally as important, if not more, in the outdoors.





How is the Foundation Phase implemented,

There are three types of provision that we have here at St Winefride's. They are as follows;

Continuous Provision

Enhanced Provision

Focus / Directed
Activities



What is the Continuous Provision?





Continuous Provision is what we provide for children everyday, within our learning e.g. sand, water etc.

What is Enhanced Provision?

Enhanced Provision is what you add to the Continuous Provision to create additional/enhanced learning opportunities e.g. adding numbers 1-5 into water for children to fish out and put in order.

Reception children will complete Rainbow challenges.





What are Directed Activities?

Directed or focus activities are specific, planned activities usually led by the teacher, working with the children in small groups / pairs.

This involves high quality adult/child interaction to practise and apply a taught skill e.g. counting / ordering numbers.




Learning to Read and Write

We believe that learning to read should be a fun, engaging activity for the children, and we like to use a variety of teaching styles to implement this.

We use the very successful scheme called:

Jolly Phonics.



Learning to Read and Write

In Nursery, we practice the sounds and actions and learn and sing the songs that go with each sound.

Children will practice their listening skills and then some children will begin to recognise some of our sounds by the end of the year.





Learning to Read and Write

By Reception, we hope children will be ready to go on and start to blend and segment these sounds together to read and write.

Every child is different and moves at their own pace and we will support them in their journey.



Maths and Numeracy



In Nursery, we use the Numicon programme with the children.

Numicon is an inclusive, multi-sensory approach to teaching numeracy using patterns to represent each numeral.

Numicon teaches children about numbers and what they mean, before and alongside counting and pattern activities through hands-on activities.

Maths and Numeracy

In Reception, we use the Inspire Maths programme with the children.

It is a very successful approach which encourages children to learn through the concrete-pictoral-abstract approach.



What if my child has additional learning needs?

If your child has a specific additional learning, developmental or medical need, we will work, alongside you and your child, to find the best way to support them in their development and access all the relevant support and advice from outside agencies to ensure the very best learning journey for your child.

The Foundation Phase has been designed to help all children flourish, whatever their stage of development or learning ability.





Staff will observe your child and their progress against the progression steps on a daily basis to identify what they can do now and and plan for what we need to help them with to get to the next step.





Planning in the moment and learning stories

If your child is entering Nursery, their teacher will be meeting with you once or twice a year to share a learning story with you.

Through a planning-in-the-moment approach where the teacher will spend time in the areas, following your child's interests and supporting and enhancing their play. We can create and gather excellent learning opportunities that will support your child's development.

From the time spent enhancing this play, their teacher will generate a learning story about the moment to briefly share with you what happened. It will also give you a chance to have a catch up with their teacher throughout the year.

Once you have signed up to the rules of our Seesaw code of conduct, you will be able to like photos, make comments on your child's learning that we can share with them and private message the school staff with any important messages.

Seesaw will be your window into your child's learning.

In Nursery, Children will be given the opportunity to take home a story book from school to share with you on a weekly basis.

This will be a book that we encourage you to read to your child and encourage them to talk about the pictures, the characters and the story.

This is to be brought back to school and changed for a new one on a weekly basis.

The more stories you can share the more progress your child will make in all areas!





When they are ready, your child will be sent home with sound cards and a reading book to share on a weekly basis and a yellow reading diary.

They may also bring home some key words.

These are 'tricky' words which cannot be sounded out or words they need to practise from their reading books.

We would ask that you spend some time, as often as possible, practising these words and sharing the book, listening and supporting them to read it and to discuss the story.



We hope to provide a reading session for parents at some point next year, where we will share effective strategies for helping support your child with reading.


Some of the other things that we would encourage you to do at home to support your child's development, include:

Reading and sharing a story every day
Talk, talk, talk!!
Singing songs and nursery rhymes
Reciting numbers to 10 / 20
Practising counting objects
Colouring
Building
Encouraging independent toileting / dressing
skills.

Taster Session

Nursery children will all be welcomed to join our taster session. During this time they will have the opportunity to explore the provision areas, get to meet new friends and some staff in class.

Children will be given the book 'The Colour Monster goes to School' and their own little plush monster. We encourage you to read, share and explore this book with your child in preparation for September.



What if I need to speak to staff?

For any other queries, concerns or issues, we welcome you to make an appointment with the class teacher who will happily meet you to discuss / give advice and support.

We have an open-door policy and welcome parents to share and support in their child's journey. We will always make time for you and are here, not only to provide care and support your children but you, our families as well.
